1. Ponzi & High-Yield Investment Scams Examples: Bit Connect, Plus Token, Gain Bitcoin Nature: Promise high returns with little risk, pay early investors with new investors' money, then collapse.

2. Fake ICOs (Initial Coin Offerings)Examples: Pincoin, Savedroid, Prodeum Nature: Fraudulent token sales where scammers disappear after raising funds.



3. Rug Pulls (Exit Scams) Examples: Squid Game Token, Thodex, AnubisDAO Nature: Developers abandon a project after stealing investors' funds

  4. Phishing ScamsExamples: Fake MetaMask/Trust Wallet websites, Elon Musk giveaway scams
   Nature: Trick users into revealing private keys or sending crypto to fraudulent addresses.
- 5. Fake Exchanges & Wallets Examples: Fake Binance apps, iCenter (fake trading platform) Nature: Mimic legitimate platforms to steal login credentials or deposits.

6. Pump-and-Dump Schemes Examples: Many low-cap altcoins (e.g., "Meme Coin" scams)

Nature: Inflate a coin's price artificially, then sell off, leaving others with worthless tokens.

7. Romance Scams (Crypto Scamming)Examples: Fake profiles on dating apps

**Nature:** Scammers build trust, then convince victims to invest in fake crypto schemes.

- 8. Cloud Mining Scams Examples: Mining Max, Bit Club Network Nature: Offer fake cloud mining contracts with unrealistic returns.
- 9. Impersonation Scams Examples: Fake Elon Musk, Vitalik Buterin tweets

**Nature:** Celebrities or influencers are impersonated to promote scams.

10. Malware & Ransomware Attacks Examples: Crypto Locker, Wanna Cry Nature: Hackers encrypt victims' files and demand Bitcoin for decryption. 11. Fake Airdrops & Giveaways Examples: Fake Uniswap, Open Sea airdrops Nature: Trick users into connecting wallets to steal funds. 12. Al & Trading Bot Scams Examples: Fake Al trading bots (e.g., Arbitrage Bot scams) Nature: Promise automated profits but steal deposits. Estimated Number of Crypto Scams Thousands of crypto scams exist, with new ones emerging daily. According to Chain alysis (2023), over \$5.9 billion was lost to crypto scams in 2022, including Ponzi schemes, rug pulls, and DeFi exploits.

**Decentralization (No Central Control) Unlike** traditional banks or governments, crypto currencies operate on block chain technology, which is distributed across a network of computers. No single entity (like a bank or government) can manipulate or shut it down easily.

Security & Transparency Transactions are 2. secured by cryptography, making fraud extremely difficult. All transactions are recorded on a public ledger (block chain), ensuring transparency. 3. Fast & Low-Cost Transactions (Especially for Cross-Border Payments)Sending money internationally via banks can take days and involve high fees. Crypto transactions can be completed in minutes or seconds with much

lower fees.4. Financial Inclusion (Banking the Unbanked) Over 1. Billion people worldwide lack access to 4 traditional banking. Cryptocurrencies allow anyone with a smart phone and internet to participate in the global economy. 5. Protection Against Inflation Many crypto currencies (like Bitcoin) have a fixed supply, meaning they can't be printed endlessly like fiat money. This makes them a potential

# hedge against inflation and currency devaluation.

Ownership & Control Over Funds You hold your own private keys (unlike banks where they control your money). No risk of account freezes or government seizures (unless you lose access).

Programmability (Smart Contracts & DeFi) Cryptos like Ethereum allow self-executing contracts (smart contracts) that automate

agreements without middlemen. DeFi (Decentralized Finance) offers lending, borrowing, and trading without banks. Potential for High Returns (But Also High 8. **Risk!)Early investors in Bitcoin, Ethereum, and** other cryptos saw massive gains. However, the market is highly volatile— prices can crash just as fast as they rise. Weaknesses to **Consider (For Balance)**Volatility: Prices swing wildl. Regulation Risks: Governments may impose restrictions. Security Risks: If you lose your private key, funds are gone forever.
